WVU College of Law Update on Accommodations

After discussions with Daniel Long and Susan Henigin of <u>WVU OAS</u>, here is how the College of Law will address accommodation issues:

- 1. If you receive extended time on exams:
 - a. You will continue to receive that extra time for specifically scheduled finals during exam weeks.
 - b. Under our existing rules, take home exams that normally allow a student more than 24 hours are not entitled to extra time.
- 2. For individuals with reduced distraction accommodations:
 - a. We will not be able to allow individuals into the building for purposes of studying or taking exams. We apologize, but there is a strict no-access policy in place right now.
 - b. Please check with your OAS case manager and discuss whether you could get additional time on exams or other accommodations to assist with this issue.
 - c. OAS strongly recommends that you reach out to your health care provider to set up a plan to deal with distraction issues during this time.
- 3. If you have a handwriting accommodation, please reach out to <u>Associate Dean</u> <u>Wilson</u> to make appropriate arrangements.
- 4. If you have a recording accommodation
 - a. We will ask all of our professors to record their lectures based upon whatever platform they are using; however, these platforms are new to all of us so feel free to remind them ... gently ... to record and post their notes.
 - b. If you are recording a lecture on a new platform, please let your professor know that you are doing so and recall that any restrictions on use and distribution that were imposed previously continue to apply.
- 5. If you have a different accommodation that I have not addressed here, please reach out to <u>Associate Dean Wilson</u>.
