The law library supports dissemination of faculty scholarship on SSRN, the West Virginia University law community repository, selected works, and HeinOnline. Scholarly impact metrics are collected on a quarterly basis from the West Virginia University law community repository, SSRN, HeinOnline, Google Scholar (using publish or perish) and Westlaw for all tenured and tenure track faculty. Data collected is quantitative as to total number of citing references to faculty work and qualitative (who and for what purpose) as to nature of the citation. Scholarly impact metrics are but a single tool to informing a scholar as to the life cycle of their scholarship.

Increased outreach efforts aimed at bench and bar to meet the legal information needs of the bench and bar and citizens of West Virginia. Initiatives achieved include support for the Center for Consumer Law and Education, creation of research guides in support of Attorney Services and West Virginia legal research, a streamlined document delivery service, continuing legal education programming, and increased outreach efforts through the *West Virginia Bar Blast*.
