KEY INITIATIVES

West Virginia University College of Law

Participated in development of cutting-edge scholarly impact report providing citing documents bibliography to faculty members. This report expands our existing scholarly impact report service. A bibliography permits a scholar to see who is citing their work for further engagement, promotion, and development of future scholarly projects. This report builds on the quarterly impact report of impact metrics covering SSRN, an Institutional Repository, HeinOnline, Google Scholar (using

publish or perish), Westlaw journals, Westlaw cases, and Westlaw briefs available to all faculty members by request.

Implemented scholarly communications program to facilitate the promotion and discovery of legal scholarship at West Virginia University College of Law. The law library supports the dissemination of faculty scholarship on SSRN, the West Virginia University law community repository, selected works, and HeinOnline. Scholarly impact metrics are collected every quarter from the West Virginia University law community repository, SSRN, HeinOnline, Google Scholar (using publish or perish), and Westlaw for all tenured and tenure track faculty. Data collected is quantitative as to the total number of citing references to faculty work and qualitative (who and for what purpose) as to the nature of the citation. Scholarly impact metrics are but a single tool for informing a scholar as to the life cycle of their scholarship.

Led team of librarians in the creation of one credit asynchronous Introduction to Legal Research class with multiple forms of formative and summative assessment for fall 2019 as part of COVID-19 response.

Established the Racial Justice Collection as a collection of materials to encourage engagement, awareness, and understanding targeting topics of gender, sex, class, LGBTQ+ studies, indigenous studies, settler colonialism studies, and the environment.

Engaged in the strategic planning process, developed strategic initiatives focuses on library service to the law school, University, community, and state resulting in the strategic map at https://www.law.wvu.edu/files/d/22218731-41c0-4392-9a55-dc7798eff355/law-library-strategic-map.pdf.

Increased support for faculty scholarship through the establishment of a library research assistant program.

Increased outreach efforts aimed at the bench and bar to meet the legal information needs of the bench and bar and citizens of West Virginia. Initiatives achieved include support for the Center for Consumer Law and Education, creation of research guides in support of Attorney Services and West Virginia legal research, a streamlined document delivery service, continuing legal education programming, and increased outreach efforts through the *West Virginia Bar Blast*.

Supervised a team of as many as 17 FTE in the library and faculty services departments and 6 teaching assistants known as Burks Scholars.

Maintained nationally recognized W&L Law Journal Rankings.

Implemented institutional repository to promote legal scholarship and preservation of information. Became the fourteenth bepress law repository to reach one million downloads.

Established Washington and Lee Law Reads program for law school to highlight the importance of reading for pleasure. *To Kill a Mockingbird* and *All the President's Men* featured as the first two selections with the event culminating in a panel discussion featuring noted experts from multiple departments within the University.

Created McThenia Research Assistant pool for a law library to expand quality research support for faculty scholarship.

Increased number of dual-degreed librarians through strategic realignment of library resources and elimination of obsolete workflows.

Created Student News Awareness Program and faculty current awareness program utilizing news aggregator InfoNgen. This initiative supported the creation and dissemination of a highly individualized current awareness newsletter for faculty and provides students with timely access to the news of the week.

Designed and built library space for the millennial generation within the existing footprint of the library in a manner to support and further facilitate a strategic transformation of the law library from a traditional library to a service organization supporting the faculty, students, and administration. As part of such renovation, I worked to ensure gender-neutral restrooms and disability accessibility.

Using the liberal arts model, created and taught *Introduction to the Legal Profession* course for undergraduates in Washington & Lee's innovative spring term semester.
