Required: Seminar Course

- Small-sized class with discussions geared toward the production of a substantial (i.e. 25+ pages) written product supported by extensive research
- Offered in fall and spring semesters
- Typically 2 credits
- May take anytime before graduation
- Must earn a grade of “C” or better
- Usually **red colored** on the schedule grid

Required: Appellate Advocacy

- Drafting of an appellate brief and an argumentation of the brief, similar to legal writing
- Offered in fall and spring semesters, and occasionally in the summer too
- Typically 2 credits
- May take anytime before graduation
- Must earn a grade of “C” or better
- Usually **green colored** on the schedule grid

Required: Capstone Course

- Provides students with opportunity to synthesize critically and apply knowledge and skills they have developed during law school
- May take anytime before graduation
- Choose From:
 - Business Transaction Drafting
 - Trial Advocacy, with Evidence pre-req.
 - Clinic, with potential pre-reqs.
 - Federal Externship, with Evidence pre-req.

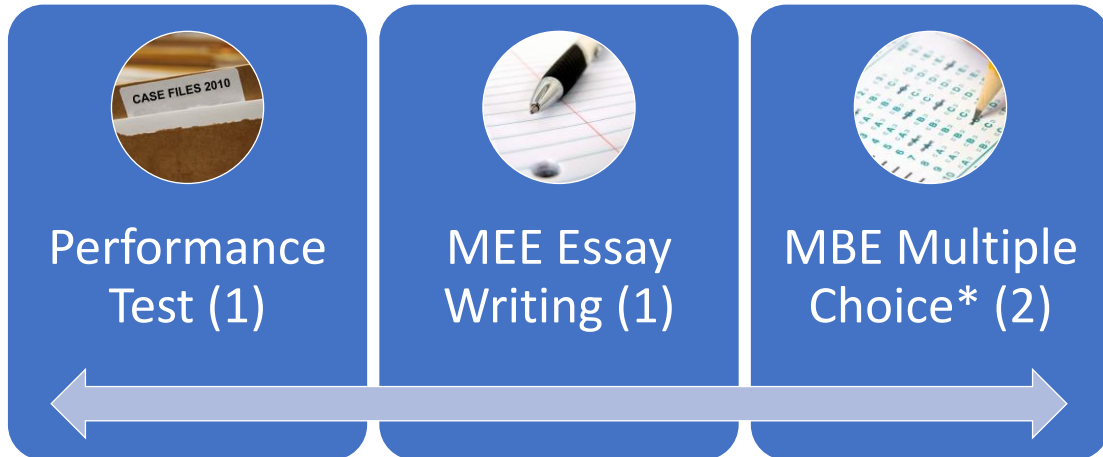

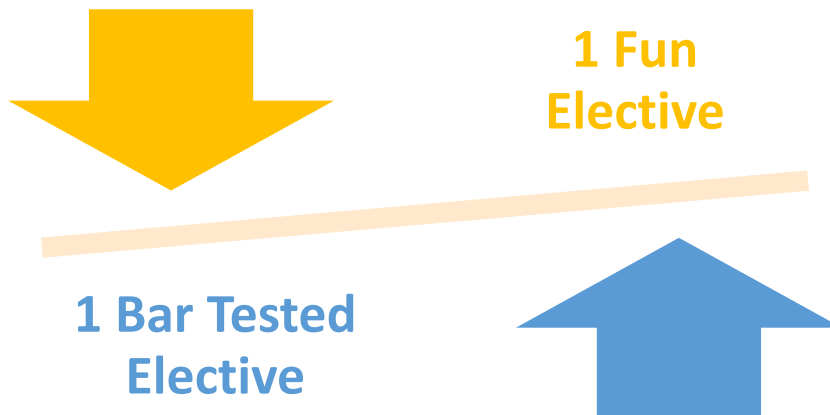

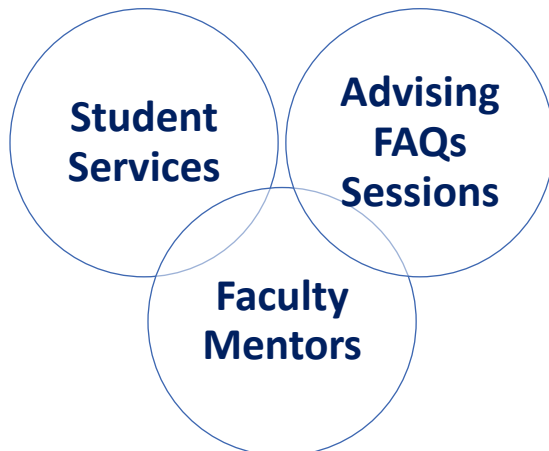
Typical Career Paths

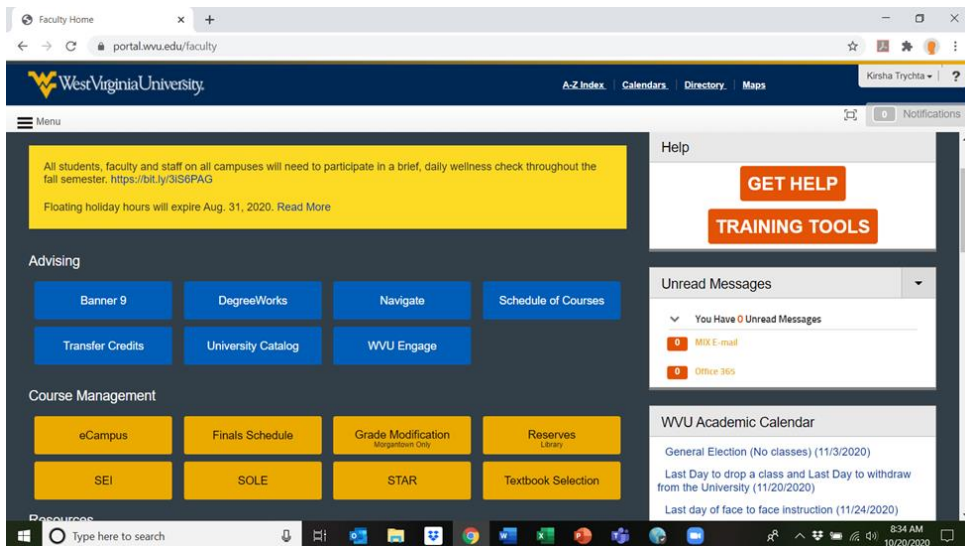

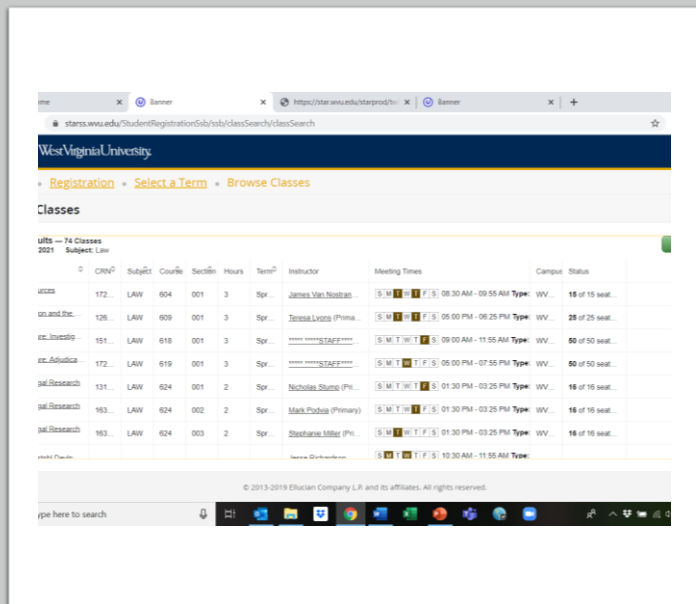
