Graduate may place an "In Honor of" or "In Memory of" dedication in the Commencement program for the purpose of recognizing special people in the their life.

Check one

- **Option 1 \$10** Dedication cannot exceed 75 characters in length, including spaces.
- **Option 2 \$20** Dedication cannot exceed 160 characters in length, including spaces.

Collected funds will be deposited in the designated 3L Class Gift Fund (e.g. WVU Law Class of 2015 Gift) at the West Virginia University Foundation. The money will be used for the collective Class Gift as determined by the 3L Class Officers.
