ORDER OF BARRISTERS APPLICATION

Guidelines for Faculty Selection of Students to the Order of Barristers

The Order of Barristers is a recognized national honorary organization whose purpose is to encourage the development of written and oral advocacy skills through effective law school programs by formal recognition of the best advocates that those programs produce.

Guidelines for selection:

- 1. All graduating students are eligible to apply for Order of the Barristers for the year that they graduate.
- 2. The selection process shall be governed by a committee of faculty members chosen by the Dean.
- 3. The number of awards is limited.
- 4. Students shall be selected based on excellence in advocacy as demonstrated in classes and in trial and appellate advocacy competitions and programs either intramural or intercollegiate according to the point system below.
